- This semester we have partnered with Garrett Lancaster, Voc/Rec Manager for Nexus, to offer an Industrial Arts class to the students as an elective class. Garrett is teaching the students about woodworking, welding, and automotive skills. This hands-on class has been a great addition to our schedule. The first project the students worked on was making a wooden spatula. We are so thankful for our relationship with Nexus so that we could offer this class, as we don't have the resources within our own staffing to provide such a class. Thank you Garrett!
